Those who excel in this selection process, CIT offers scholarship for pursuing Free Engineering Education for one student in each discipline. 4. The Practice CIT offers Free Education through CITCAT since 2008. Standard Selection Procedure followed in CITCAT Level 1. Written Test (online) An online based test will be
