In such meetings, the Parents were usually given a chance to speak about their observations and suggestions towards the delivery of Teaching and administrative quality provided by the Institution for improvement. Apart from such verbal information, Parents Feedback information through Paper Survey has been duly arranged.

Ratings are expressed as the following:

4 = Excellent	3 = Good	2 = Fair	1 = Average
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Only Single Grading can be given by the Respondent against each parameters in the scale and thus the possible grading is equivalent to 1 – 4 grade value in each parameter. Since there are 15 (Fifteen) different parameters, the possible grading value is 15 – 60.

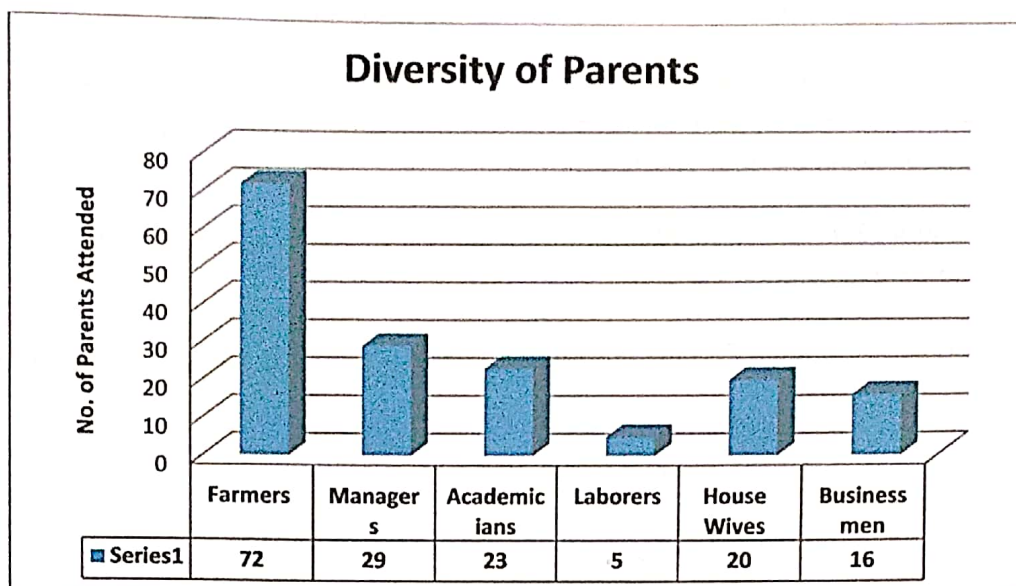


Figure No.1: Diversity of Parents

The actual Total No. of responses given in each grade against each parameter has been shown in the Table above and it appears that the overall highest No. of responses is 71.61% (1128)

found against the Grade "EXCELLENT", which means that majority of the Parents found that Institution is worth to grade as "EXCELLENT" in the four points scale.

At the same time, the overall lowest No. of responses is 0.3% (05) which is found against the grade "FAIR" which means that very small No. of the respondents found that Institution is worth to grade as "FAIR" in the four points scale.

Whereas only 23.23% (366) and 0.5% (09) of respondent Parents felt like to give "GOOD" and "AVERAGE" grades respectively.

Further, 4.2% (67) of respondent Parents felt like parameter were "NOT APPLICABLE" and not responded.





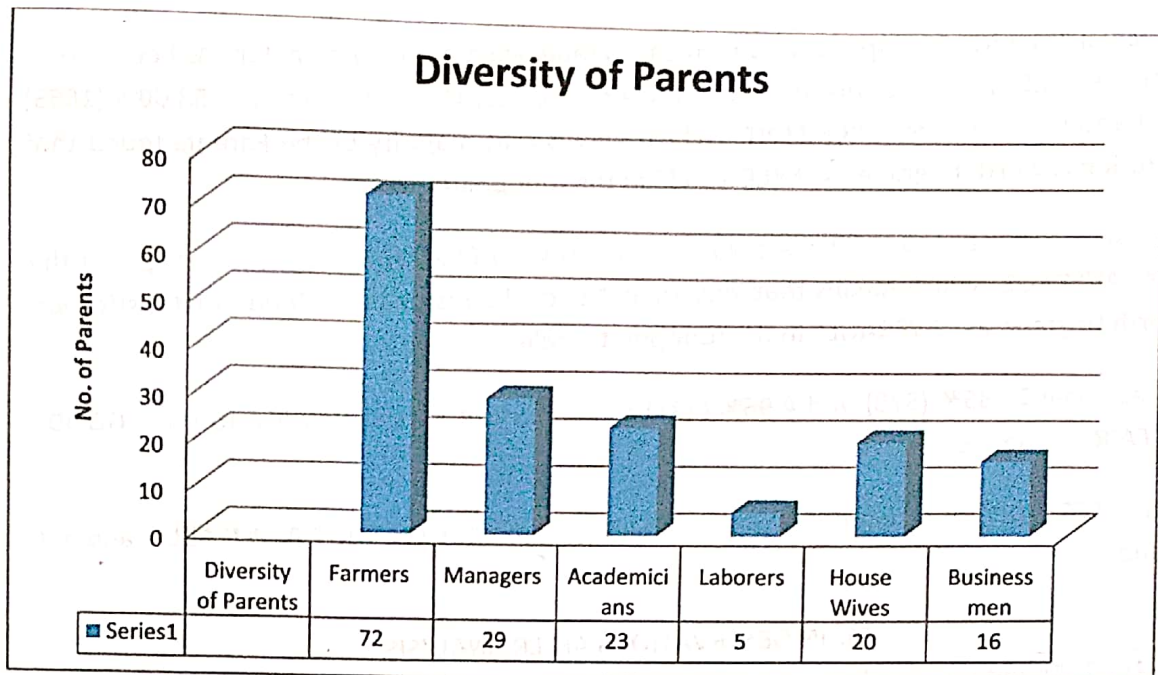


Figure No.1: Diversity of Parents

The actual Total No. of responses given in each grade against each parameter has been shown in the Table above and it appears that the overall highest No. of responses is **68.00% (1683)** found against the Grade **"EXCELLENT"**, which means that majority of the Parents found that Institution is worth to grade as **"EXCELLENT"** in the four points scale.

At the same time, the overall lowest No. of responses is **1.05% (26)** which is found against the grade **"AVERAGE"** which means that very small No. of the respondents found that Institution is worth to grade as **"AVERAGE"** in the four points scale.

Whereas only **23.35% (578)** and **4.96% (123)** of respondent Parents felt like to give **"GOOD"** and **"FAIR"** grades respectively.

Further, **2.62% (65)** of respondent Parents felt like parameter were **"NOT APPLICABLE"** and not responded.
